NEW BEGINNINGS: LENT

I want to reinforce the idea of a personal rule. As Anglicans, we are richly blessed by the Benedictine heritage. It is a personal and communal guide that leans heavily on the Scriptures and the wisdom of the Early Church. When I refer to Classical Christian faith, or identify as a “Traditional” or “Ancient Faith” Christian, this is what I mean.

The Benedictine way emphasizes “prayer, work, study” and affirms normal life as the place where we meet God. It is grounded (stability) in a particular place with a particular community. The focus is on growth and ongoing conversion, as we constantly seek to love God and each other. We do not chase the latest fads or church hop in the never ending quest for the next new thing. Hospitality, the warm welcome of anyone as we would greet Christ, is part of our communal life. The centrality of Scripture (in worship and study) is obvious as we pray the daily liturgies and engage in constant Bible studies. The Benedictine way is mundane and practical, yet, as we ponder its depth, we realize that the simple practices that govern our lives are actually a powerful connection to God, motivated not by feelings, but by real love.


One goal of this process is self-knowledge, so that we can be free to encounter God and one another authentically. Once more I commend the Enneagram and Myers Briggs personality tools as ways to discover how your wounds and pathologies stand in the way of *theosis* and holy union with God as your True Self. You are the image of God. Adopt a life style that makes that reality shine more clearly each day. I pray this will be your best Lent ever!
